I have explored many media over a long period of time in order to arrive at my present method of working. As my art evolved, I find that I can paint more freely, and express my ideas more vividly. Most recently I have tried to indicate my respect for truth and directness by consolidating thoughts and ideas to their essence.

As I did with the serigraphs, I translated many of my collage images into prints. Presently I have translated some of my recent collages into limited archival editions of 30. These were done in collaboration with Glastonbury Design Corp., where the finest of inks and papers are used to create images that are not only permanent, but so exact that even I cannot tell the difference between the collage and the archival print unless I examine them very closely.

My present artistic medium is collage. I paint various shapes with acrylic paint, and incorporate foreign materials such as straw, sand, sawdust - and most recently, cherry stems. These added fibers create textures in my work, producing shadows, and making the surface more varied and the composition more interesting.

During my student years with Paul Zimmerman, I was introduced to the magical world of Cezanne, Braque, Manet, and Picasso. They and so many other artists continue to inspire me. I can't think of anything I would rather do than go to a museum to stand before a beautiful Matisse or Bonnard, and fall in love with their work all over again.

Art has filled my life, and has become my main focus. I am always surprised when someone says to me "Do you still paint?" I realize that they don't know me at all.

My passion for art is who I am. And as the years have gone by, it all feels deeper and more meaningful.
