Robert K. Abbett

Biography[edit]

Abbett was born in 1926 in Hammond, Indiana.

During the late-1950s, 1960s and 1970s, **Robert Abbett**, also credited as **Bob Abbett**, illustrated book covers for <u>war novels</u>, detective novels, thrillers, historical fiction and science fiction. Today, Abbett is best known for his paintings of <u>wildlife</u>(in particular, <u>dogs</u>), <u>wilderness</u>, <u>sporting</u>, and <u>fishing</u>.

His illustrations have been featured in a large number of <u>books</u>, <u>magazines</u>, and <u>advertising</u>. He has also authored or been featured in several art-related books, including *A Season for Painting: The Outdoor Paintings of Robert K. Abbett* and *Wings from Cover: The Upland Images of Robert Abbett and Ed Gray*.

Abbett is a graduate of both the <u>University of Missouri</u> and <u>Purdue University</u>. In 1953, Abbett moved to rural <u>Connecticut</u>where he built a <u>house</u> on an old <u>farm</u> (namely, Oakdale Farm^[1]). There, Abbett was inspired by the untouched wilderness and <u>forests</u>, and began painting what he has become famous for today: animals and countrylife.

He died on June 20, 2015 at the age of 89 in Bridgewater, Connecticut. [2]


