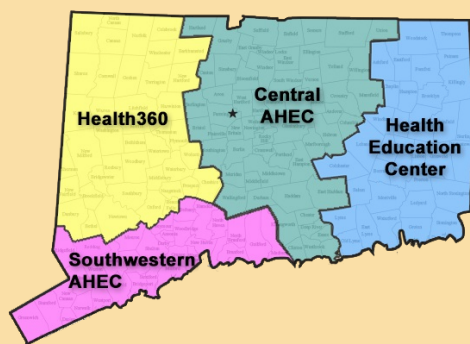

CT AHEC is charged by the U.S. Bureau of Health Workforce to provide training to health professions students and health professionals that ensures their delivery of high quality, culturally competent, and patient-centered care to all patients, especially those who are vulnerable and underserved. To that end, the CT AHEC Network has developed a variety of trainings and continuing education opportunities that address current and emerging health care and public health issues.

Working with collaborative partners, CT AHEC offers online, in-person, and hybrid programming (i.e., classroom instruction and additional online training), with some incorporating both didactic and community-based clinical components. In addition to emerging and current issues (e.g., Connecticut's opioid crisis), CT AHEC focus areas include behavioral health integration, team-based care, practice transformation, cultural competency, and addressing social determinants of health.
