Farmington Fire Department Tunxis Hose first responders saved a man in ventricular fibrillation cardiac arrest with rapid application of their AED, delivering one shock The man received cardiac by-pass surgery at **John Dempsey Hospital** and walked out two weeks later with full neurological recovery. Great job by Tunxis Hose as well as crews from **American Medical Response** and the **UCONN Fire Department**.

STEMI Alert with Medical Control

When calling in a STEMI Alert or Possible STEMI Alert, it is vital to <u>ask for</u> <u>Medical Control</u>. Asking for Medical Control, guarantees an ED MD will hear your patch, and based on the patch and/or transmitted ECG, will be



able to immediately activate the cardiac cath lab. Failure to ask for medical control may delay cath lab activation.
