
accompanied by dizziness, vomiting and pale, cool, diaphoretic skin. Salva did an immediate 12-lead ECG, and recognizing the ST elevation with reciprocal changes, called in a **STEMI ALERT** to **UConn John Dempsey Hospital**. The patient went up to the cath lab on the EMS stretcher. His 100% occlusion of the right coronary artery (RCA) was successfully cleared and stented, restoring perfusion. **34 Minute Door-to-Balloon. 54 Minute First Medical Contact-to Balloon.** Great job team!

The new renewal forms are being issued by regional EMS Coordinators. Be sure to complete them and return them per your sponsor hospital's policy if you wish to maintain current medical control.


