On 11/20/25 and 11/21/25, Education Council reviewed the proposed changes to the School of Medicine Bylaws proposed by the Dean. While we agree with sentiment expressed in the Dean's proposed changes to Section A.2 on page 10, we proposed the new language below which encompasses the broader scope of Education Council's role and responsibilities and specifically uses LCME language when describing the function of the Committee on Undergraduate Medical Education (CUME). Education Council held a special meeting on 11/28/2025 and all members present voted to approve our proposed language changes unanimously (14-0) with no abstentions.

## A. Education Council (EC)

#### 1. Duties

The EC formulates policies and plans for all <u>SOM-sponsored</u> educational activities sponsored by the <u>SOMacross</u> the educational continuum which-includeing, but are not limited to, the undergraduate medical education, graduate and postgraduate medical education, continuing medical education, and community education. School of Medicine Bylaws Amendment Request

In February 2025, I attended a meeting of Oversight Committee at which I presented at the request of Dr. Bruce Liang, Dean of the School of Medicine (SOM), the following for Oversight Committee's consideration.

On page 14, Section 2, under the Authority of the Dean's Council, there is a sentence that reads: "The Dean's Council has authority to overturn a negative decision by the SAPC on promotion or tenure only on non-academic grounds." Since award of tenure is exclusively an academic decision, tenure cannot be awarded on non-academic grounds. Therefore, the SOM Bylaws should be amended to remove the reference to "or tenure" in the section that speaks to the authority of Dean's Council in overturning negative decisions by the SAPC based on non-academic grounds.

Oversight Committee noted this proposed amendment did not fall under the Footnote 20 exception for grammatical or typographic errors, and as such if approved to move forward would necessitate the full amendment process. Following Oversight Committee's discussion, it voted unanimously to initiate the process of amending the SOM Bylaws to remove the "or tenure" language from the Dean's Council Authority regarding overturning negative tenure decisions by the SAPC.

On behalf of the dean, I am requesting that Oversight Committee proceed with the amendment process outlined in the SOM Bylaws by gathering position papers from the governing councils before presenting this proposal at a faculty forum and moving forward with a faculty vote, the outcome of which will determine whether the proposal will be presented for approval to the Academic Affairs Subcommittee of the Board of Directors, and the UConn Health Board of Directors.
