#### Kristina Delgado



The 2025 UConn Health Graduate School Commencement speaker was Biomedical Science Ph.D. graduate **Kristina Delgado**.

Born in Mexico City, Mexico and raised in Cuenca, Ecuador, Kristina moved to the U.S. at 18 and served in the U.S. Navy on the USS Abraham Lincoln before earning a B.S. in Biological Sciences from Georgia State University. She joined the UConn Health Biomedical Science Ph.D. program in 2021.

"We chose these paths—medicine, dentistry, public health, and biomedical research—because we care," Kristina said in her commencement speech. "We are driven by a desire to help, to heal, to discover, and to improve lives. That shared purpose is what unites us. And now, with our degrees in hand, it's time to turn the passion that brought us here into action. It is our time! Keep growing. Keep showing up. Keep making a difference because the world needs what we bring. From this moment on, it is our turn."

Every year UConn Health & AHEC host the CT Junior Science and Humanities Symposium, which invites h.s. students around the state to present their own research & learn about the research of their peers. This incredibly successful event cultivates science and research experiences for younger students. For the past two years, the UConn Health Graduate School DEI Committee, in collaboration with The Cato T. Laurencin Institute for Regenerative Engineering and the Young Explorers in Science (YES) Program, has expanded access to this event by inviting and providing transportation for students from schools that primarily serve underrepresented & disadvantaged students. These students attend a post fair career symposium called High School Science Summit: Cultivating Future Biomedical Innovators to learn about diverse paths and journeys, and different biomedical career opportunities. This year, students were fortunate to hear from Dr. Jeffrey Hines (UConn Health Chief Diversity Officer) and Dr. Jenna Bartley (Graduate School DEI Committee Chair), as well as graduate students Kristina Delgado, Angela Power, Alex Mitchell, and Allison Aviles. Students also toured UConn Health laboratories to gain a more hands-on understanding of research and lab work. They were able to ask thoughtful questions and engage with our researchers to gain a better understanding of biomedical careers opportunities available both at UConn Health and beyond.

## Student Kudos!









#### **Recent Faculty Honors**
