>>Registration Reminder<<

Spring 2026 registration is now open.

Register NOW and avoid these common errors:

>>Check <u>Student Admin</u> for *registration holds* and address asap if you have one; some holds do not clear immediately.

>> Professors may cancel classes not meeting the minimum enrollment—register asap so you aren't left scrambling to meet credit requirements!

>>Unenrolled or underenrolled students will be *automatically* discontinued from their program on the 10th day of classes.

If this happens, you must apply for reinstatement AND pay a \$65 reinstatement fee that is the student's responsibility (not your program/the Grad School).

Graduate assistants (GAs)

>>must enroll in at least 6 credits to be considered full-time
>>students supported on federal fellowship awards
(individual or institutional) must enroll in
at least 9 credits to be considered full-time.

Additionally, the tuition waiver will not post to the fee bill until a GA is registered for at least 6 credits.

Not registering in a timely fashion can result in a Bursar Hold on the account, blocking enrollment

and other services, as well as incurring late fees.

UConn's <u>Knowledge Base</u> provides step-by-step instructions on managing your enrollment through the Student Administration system.






