Dr. Louise McCullough, M.D., Ph.D.

Professor of Neurology and Neuroscience
Director of Stroke Research

“Translational Studies in Stroke”

Dr. Louise McCullough is a Professor of Neurology and Neuroscience at the University of Connecticut Health Center. She is a clinician-scientist with a specific interest in the gender differences in stroke and vascular diseases. While spending several months a year on one of the busiest “stroke services” in New England she supervises multiple clinical projects using our well established stroke center databases. Louise’s clinical academic interests have been the development of emergent therapies for acute ischemic and hemorrhagic stroke; neurology residency education in

stroke care; and the creation of a regional stroke network, the largest in southern New England. Louise obtained her undergraduate and graduate training at the University of Connecticut and then came to the University of Connecticut Health Center where she obtained an MD in 1996. She completed her post-graduate training in neurology and stroke at Johns Hopkins. Dr. McCullough was recruited in 2004 by UCHC to start a clinical and research program in stroke and was promoted to full professorship in 2012.
