Dr. Henry Anyimadu, MD, FACP, FIDSA, AAHIVS is a Ghanaian born American who graduated from the University of Ghana Medical School as the Best Student in Community Health Practice in 2004. He completed an internal medicine residency and infectious diseases fellowship at Columbia University affiliation at Harlem Hospital Center in New York. He is currently an infectious disease consultant at the Hospital of Central Connecticut and Midstate Medical Center. He is the Hepatitis C Clinic director at the Hospital of Central Connecticut and an associate professor of Medicine at the University of Connecticut School of Medicine.

Dr. Anyimadu is a fellow of the Infectious Diseases Society of America and the American College of Physicians and board-certified in internal medicine and infectious diseases.

He has received numerous awards in his field, including the '2018 Excellence in Teaching Award in Infectious Diseases' from the University of Connecticut Infectious Diseases fellowship program and the Thornton Award for First Place Poster from the Connecticut Infectious Diseases Society. During his infectious diseases training, he received the prestigious

"Fellowship award for commitment and outstanding contribution towards improving the quality of the internal medicine and infectious diseases program at Harlem Hospital."

Dr. Anyimadu holds current appointments on several committees, to name a few: Member of the Medical Executive Committee of the Hospital of Central Connecticut, Co-chair of the Membership Committee for the Connecticut Chapter of the American College of Physicians, Member of the Infection Prevention Committee at the Hospital of Central Connecticut, and Member of the University of Connecticut Infectious Diseases Fellowship Operations Committee.

With a desire to stay ahead of the curve, Dr. Anyimadu maintains membership in several professional societies, including the American College of Physicians, Infectious Diseases Society of America (IDSA), and the American Academy of HIV Specialists. He has given many oral and poster presentations, published a book chapter in HIV and Gastrointestinal Complications, and published many research papers.

With the advent of the COVID-19 pandemic, Dr. Anyimadu has been a remarkable force in the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic; treating patients, educating people through multiple media interviews, and being a strong advocate for vaccinations.

He believes in giving back to the community and, as a result, volunteers through the IDSA to help the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) with COVID-19 Clinician calls, volunteers as an advisory board member for the Connecticut AIDS Drug Assistance Program, and serves as a leader for BLAST (Boys Learning and Serving Together) at the Valley Community Baptist Church, Avon, CT.
