OPT - The Basics

- OPT is a benefit for F-1 students to work off-campus in a field directly related to their major area of study.
- An offer of employment is not required at the time you apply for OPT.
 - However, once OPT is approved, you have a maximum of <u>90 days</u> of unemployment allowed over the 12 months.
 - If you change employment, gaps in employment count!
 - If starting your job later than EAD start date, that counts!
- OPT employment must be directly related to your field of study.
- You must be physically present in the U.S. and in active F-1 status at the time of application.

OPT - The Basics

- You are allowed a total of 12 months of full-time OPT per degree level.
- While on OPT, your F-1 visa is still sponsored by UCHC, even if you are working elsewhere
- You have **90 days of unemployment** allowed under regular post-completion OPT.

First Steps

- Determine your official Program Completion Date (PCD)
 - PhD Students
 - Discuss you defense dates with your advisor and your committee.
 - Pass private defense, then determine public defense date and thesis submission date
 Thesis submission date = PCD
 - Confirm date with Academic Advisor and Assoc. Dean of Grad School
 - Academic Advisor completes the **OPT Recommendation Letter**

• Dental (MDS) students

- Confirm completion of <u>both</u> MDS and clinical certificate with your Academic Advisor.
- The Associate Dean of Academic Affairs SODM will complete the OPT Recommendation Letter
- Typically MDS students complete June 30.
- You must have a thesis defense date and submit your thesis to the Graduate School for the MDS portion.
- *Program Completion Date must be <u>100% confirmed</u> before proceeding*



Next Steps

- Determine your OPT start date
 - Can be anytime within the <u>60-day</u> period following your PCD. This is <u>your</u> choice
- Gather your documents: passport, visa, I-94, previous I-20's
- Submit an OPT I-20 Request Form
- UCHC International Advisor will be in touch after you submit this form.
- Students can apply for OPT up to 90 days before PCD
- Absolute latest date for USCIS to <u>receive</u> OPT application is 60 days after PCD



Filing with USCIS

- There are two options for filing your I-765
 - Electronic Filing (e-filing)
 - Paper filing
- Many now choose to file online, but it is your decision
- We offer "E-Filing Tips" with helpful information
- Either way, you will work with your International Advisor to process the OPT request



Premium Processing

- Optional, not required
- Reduces processing time to 30 calendar days
- \$1,500 premium processing fee + \$410 filing fee
 - (Filing fee for online filing is \$470 as of 4/1/2024).
- Can be filed online or by mail

After Filing

- Let the IO know when your OPT is approved. Please send us a copy of your EAD card.
- As soon as you have a signed offer letter of employment, send a copy to the IO. Your DSO can add your employer information to SEVIS.
 - "Direct relationship between employment and a student's major area of study" – DHS Policy Guidance, 2019
- You have a <u>maximum</u> of <u>90 days</u> you can be unemployed on OPT. (150 total days with STEM extension).
- Remember to keep the UCHC IO updated if you change jobs or address – must report within 10 days!

SEVP Portal

- Allows student to report info to SEVP themselves while on OPT
- When OPT authorization approved, SEVP sends account creation email to student
- Students can update: addresses, telephone numbers, employer information and monitor their employment authorization
- Students still must send contract/offer letter and copy of EAD card to International Office
- You should update UCHC with your personal email to add to SEVIS

Employment... and beyond!

• Employment at UConn Health

- Postdoc minimum 1 year appointment
- Faculty minimum 1 year appointment
- Make sure the hiring dept reaches out to the IO to get all the HR hiring paperwork done in advance of your EAD start date.

Dental/Medical Residency

- You may want to delay your OPT start date to coincide with your residency start date.
- TRAVEL on OPT
 - I-20 must be signed
 - EAD Card
 - Offer letter or employment verification letter

Employment... and beyond!

- 24-month STEM Extension
 - ONLY for qualifying majors: Biomedical Sciences qualifies for STEM, Dentistry does not
- H-1B Filing
 - If employer is in the private sector, they are subject to the H-1B "cap." Make sure they file your H-1B by April 1 deadline for October 1 start.
- "CAP GAP" Extension
 - If you are selected in H-1B lottery, you must "bridge the gap" from end of OPT until your October 1 start. This is the "cap gap extension," it is typically automatic in SEVIS.
 - Contact the IO for questions on the cap gap extension if you are in this situation
 - Not recommended to travel during this time
