PAR FORUM

The Center for the Promotion of Health in the New England Workplace (CPH-NEW) along with The Institute for Collaboration on Health, Intervention and Policy (InCHIP) and The Center for Environmental Health and Health Promotion (CEHHP) hosted a forum on March 30, 2016 on the UConn Storrs campus. The event focused on Participatory Action Research (PAR), and featured a keynote presentation from Dr. Suzanne Cashman, a professor of Family Medicine & Community Health at the UMASS Medical School and Co-Director of Community Engagement. Panelists, including **Dr. Alicia Dugan**, provided real-world stories of their experiences within PAR. Attendees joined in a lively discussion of the benefits and barriers to this type of research, and continued the discussion within a roundtable breakout session. Attendees also heard from Dr. Martin Cherniack who introduced the CPH-NEW Research-to-Practice Pilot Grantees, Katrina Burch and Dr. Jennifer Garza.
