POLICY:

- 1. In an instance when a patient has been injured as a result of suspected criminal violence (whether or not criminal intent is known), the UCONN Police Department must be notified.
- 2. Cases involving the following must be reported:
 - A. Gunshot wounds
 - B. Knife wounds
 - C. Suspected child abuse
 - D. Serious beatings
 - E. Rape (with consent of victim)
 - F. Other injuries suspected to be a result of criminal violence
- 3. Police should be notified of any suspicious behavior noted on the premises.

PROCEDURE:

- 1. Reports to the Police Department should be made by the physician involved, nurse or the clerk.
- 2. The Police Department will act as liaison with the proper law enforcement agency.
- 3. The following information should be reported:
 - A. The patient's name
 - B. The patient's address
 - C. The time of admission
 - D. The nature of injury
- 4. A brief note that the police were notified should be made in the patient's record.
- 5. In an emergency dial 911 to reach the police.
- 6. For routine matters dial extension 2121 option 1.
