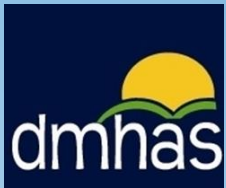

The SEOW Prevention Data Portal



- A collaborative effort between the CPES/SEOW and the Connecticut Data Collaborative (CTData)
- Data elements driven by the work of the SEOW
- Content developed and compiled by CPES
- Platform, design, user interface, and web management by CTData
- Over **200** indicators across **20** sources, and multiple domains (consumption, consequence, risk factors, social determinants of health)
- **32** interactive datasets in phase 1, with more to be added over time
- National, state, sub-state (regional), district, and town-level data
- Major updates coming soon, to support DMHAS regional planning process

Features of the Portal

- Town-level data can be aggregated to DMHAS region, community-type, District Reference Groups (DRG)
- Indicators and datasets searchable by priority problem/substance, data level, year, source, domain, and key words
- Metadata, data visualization and dataset download capability available for all pilot databases

- Resource section with links to prevention partners and data resource sites
- Downloadable content
- Pre-made, annotated data visualization products (maps, graphs, charts) available on-site for the most used indicators
- CT Epidemiological Profile Fact Sheets for all major substances
